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VOTE BY MAIL BALLOT APPLICATION FORM FOR REGISTERED VOTERS

A qualified voter may make application by mail, not more than **90** nor less than **5** days, prior to the date of the election for an official ballot for the voter's precinct, to be voted at such election. For the **March 20th, 2018** General Primary Election you may apply for an absentee ballot to be mailed from **December 20th, 2017** through **March 15th, 2018**, however ballots (unless for military and overseas voters) cannot be mailed until **February 8th, 2018**.

The Election Code requires that blank absentee ballot application forms be available. You may type or print all required information on this generic application form.

ALL ENTRIES MUST BE LEGIBLE FOR YOUR APPLICATION TO BE PROCESSED

Once you have completed, signed and dated the absentee application form it may be returned to the proper election authority either in person, via a third party or by mail. Ballots can only be issued to qualified registered voters whose written request is received by the election authority by the **March 15th, 2018** deadline if you wish your ballot to be mailed to you. You may qualify to submit your absentee application via our online application - contact the County Clerk's office for details regarding that option or with questions regarding having your ballot delivered by a third party with authorization.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO VOTERS

Although blank absentee application forms are now available, you can still request pre-printed absentee applications by calling our office. Upon verification of some personal information we will issue the application to the address you request. You may also write this office a letter requesting an absentee ballot application be issued to you but you must provide all of the necessary information for issuance of a ballot and sign the letter with your legal signature. Those voters making their request directly with this office have an opportunity to update registration information such as corrected driver's license numbers, dates of birth or updated phone or e-mail contact information. By providing us with current contact information you allow us to reach you more directly should there be any problems with your registration, the issuance of your ballot or to alert you should your ballot be returned to us undeliverable. Many voters fail to realize that their voter status may be suspended due to inactivity or an invalid name or address. If you have any concerns regarding the status of your registration or if you have any questions regarding the absentee voting process, please contact the County Clerk's Office at once at the phone number or e-mail address given in the upper right corner of this notice.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO CIRCULATORS OF APPLICATIONS

If you are distributing blank vote by mail applications for an organization or campaign, please be sure to confirm the following:

- The applicant is a registered voter
- That all required fields are completed
- The information provided is legible
- Please encourage all applicants to provide contact information in case of incomplete or missing information on their application
- Submit all completed applications you collect to the correct election authority within the time frame allowed by statute.
